


Wick St Fergus Church of Scotland



March 2017

Welcome, folks to March. Well, it's that time of the year again. Lent is almost upon us and I am sure that you will all be wondering about what to give up in order to show your identification with our Lord's temptations in the desert. I have given this some considerable thought and have come to certain, definite conclusions. This hasn't been easy since these things are very dear to my heart. Firstly, I am going to give up marathon running. Secondly, I am going to give up skydiving. Thirdly, I am going to give up eating raw Brussel sprouts. That is not what Lent is about. We have a strange view of the temptations of Christ in the desert. I won't go into detail on the temptations here (if you want that information, come and see us on Sunday mornings) but they have little to do with Christ giving stuff up.

That time has more to do with Christ giving himself to the purposes of his Father in Heaven. It is the same with our relationship with Lenten observance. We give stuff up because it makes us look the part, it makes us look "spiritual", in control of our lives. People then think: look how disciplined and purposeful that person is because they have given up Mars Bars for Lent or because they have given up putting sugar in their tea. That's the idea anyway. There are even brave souls who give up drinking Old Pulteney for Lent. That may well be the extreme end of things. But seriously for a moment, Lent is not so much about giving up, rather it is more about giving "to." It is about specifically setting a season of the year aside in order to give time to God, his purposes, time that you would have otherwise spent on yourself. Or if you are not religious it has to do with giving yourself to the welfare of others by giving up time that you would have otherwise spent on yourself.

It actually boils down to the same thing. In St John's Gospel and chapter six Jesus said, "I came not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me and this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose no one of all he has given me but raise them up on the last day." He also said in another place, "I can do nothing except what the Father shows me." In a world of competing voices, sometimes we need to listen to our inner voice of conscience, what the Bible calls the still, small voice of God. We need to take time out to look at our world, our land, our town even? We do this and we see what needs to be done but instead of stating, "something needs to be done about that" and then we sit around and complain about nothing being done, instead of that we should say, "what can I do to be part of doing something about that?"

For example, that is what the brave women at CHAT have done in campaigning for the maternity unit. That is what Mother Teresa did when she saw the poor in Calcutta. That is what Rosa Parkes did when faced with the injustice of being forced to give up her seat on the bus because she was black. Giving ourselves "to" a matter is an incredibly personal but brave thing. Sometimes we have to swim against the current of a culture of indifference to the needs of others. I found that to be the case when I used to work with homeless people and addicts and working girls in the city of Glasgow in the 90s. We would be criticised for working with people termed "undesirables".

Listen, folks, your town needs you. Your county and lands needs you. Your nation needs you. This Lenten season let's all give ourselves to this great place by getting involved in seeing our town, county and nation changed as people give themselves as gifts to one another. If you need help in doing that then come and see us at Wick St Fergus sometime. We are committed to the town and people of Wick. You know where we are.
