


Wick St Fergus Church of Scotland

Well hello and welcome to the March edition of the best newsletter in Wick. By the time you read this I will have had my birthday. I'm not going to say how old I am but let's just say that I will never see 55 again. I know that last month was a bit sad with the passing of John Houston and I wanted to be a bit more fun this month, but I find myself putting on my serious hat again. Our first session of Café Church happened at the end of February and will in future take place on the last Sunday of each month.

Café Church is about being a safe place where people can ask questions without being worried about taking a view or opinion that differs from conventional wisdom. The February session dealt with the Bible. One of the reasons I selected this subject is that a fundamentalist/literalist reading of the Bible worries me. Here at Wick St Fergus we believe that HOW one reads the Bible is as important as simply reading it for religious or doctrinal reasons. If you use it in the same way that medical people use a prescription pad (showing my age here) then it becomes an agent of oppression rather than a facilitator of liberation.

We believe, and the bible teaches us; humanity is special, that there are more good people in the world than there are bad, and that wherever love is present, then God is there also. That we are tested not against our failings but rather against God's love for us. We do not believe that the Bible teaches that humans are simply means to achieve an end. People are more than numbers on a balance sheet or data on a spreadsheet. If you are good enough for Jesus then you are good enough for us and since nobody was ever turned away by Jesus then no one, whether for religious or doctrinal reasons, has the right to exclude others because they do not fit a set of predetermined criteria. What is more, we condemn those who would see people as parcels of data or as inconveniences in some grand plan.

That is why we support the work of CHAT and all organisations that work for the good of other people, organisations like Amnesty International, Christian Aid, Caithness Foodbank, Stonewall and many more. What is sad for me is that organisations exist in the world which put ideology before compassion. A classic example of this is the way that those who struggle in our society are put through the wringer because some heartless people believe that people struggle because it is their own fault, that they are lazy and are not deserving of our time or generosity.

Jesus must be a big disappointment to people like that. He said in one place to a woman who was accused of adultery, "Where are those who accused you?" and when she couldn't find them he responded by saying, "Neither do I." And when Jesus accused the unco guid in this word of a lack of compassion for the suffering in Matthew 25 and they object to his condemnation he tells them, "In as much as you did not to this to the least of these my brothers and sisters you did not do it to me." With regard to those who dismiss those in need and who so structure things to suit their own protection, the Bible speaks of those who, "...frame wickedness through statute." If saying this kind of thing leads to people accusing us of being political then we plead, "GUILTY AS CHARGED."

Jesus is good news and when you read the Bible through the eyes of Christ we find that we have more in common with one another than those things which separate us. That is how you can tell the good from the bad; those ideas and actions that separate people from one another and which promote the benefit of a privileged few do not represent, nor can they ever represent, Christ. But don't just take my word for it. Check it out for yourself. Or maybe come and see us soon. You know where we are.
